Freeze Dried Fruit by: Jack Hinckley

Wouldn't it be cool if we could freeze-dry joy? Or put up a bunch of peace preserves when times are good, to use when times aren't so good? But the fruit of the spirit doesn't keep well. It's sort of like the manna that Moses told the refugees to never stash – except for on Saturday (Exodus 16:15 -21). The fruit of the spirit works extremely well to help us get on in this crazy life, in fact it's essential, but it only works when it's fresh. When things get difficult, remembering when we had the long suffering to deal with things like this, back in the day, back when we had that special spiritual connection, doesn't really help much now. So how can I keep my fruit fresh? Well, to continue the analogy, feed it, cultivate it, and harvest it regularly. That's what Romans 12:1, 2 is talking about, for example. That word “renewing” denotes an ongoing process, not a onetime experience. It's something we need to work at every day. As Paul said, in Hebrews 12:1, “let us run with patience”, so another key is to keep running. Carb up with fruit!
